The intended recruitment to fill the Schoninger Chair will provide a stronger infrastructure for the comprehensive program in cognition and memory.

Despite the many challenges presented by the pandemic, the educational programs continued and adapted to restrictions and inconveniences. The trustees were impressed with the remarkable success of the 12th inter-institutional meeting held virtually and hosted by the MBI at the UM. The trustees join the chorus of praise for the success of the meeting, from planning, to communication, and execution.

The trustees congratulate Dr. Sacco on yet additional honors in being named the Editor-in-Chief of the prestigious journal **Stroke** and receiving the World Hypertension League Daniel Lackland Excellence Award for Population Hypertension Risk Reduction. The trustees also congratulate Dr. Rundek upon her election as President of the Intersocietal Accreditation Commission (IAC) Vascular Testing Board and acknowledge her leadership across the various disciplines using vascular testing.
